A NEW BREED OF GRIEVER

- How do I heal when I have no previous experience as a bereaved parent?
- How do I do this thing called "recovery from loss"?
- How do I become (in the eyes of the world) a "respectabe griever"?

Those questions raced through my mind early in my grief journey. I really wasn't sure what I was supposed to do. Somehow I survived those early days, but now, almost 6 years later I find that I am still a bereaved parent and have periodic moments of grief pain that catches me off guard. I've come to realize that most people expect the bereaved to be "over it" within 3-6 months. They will allow us what they consider to be a respectable period of time, and then they become uncomfortable with our obvious pain. Six years after the death of my only child I have come to believe that we must become a new breed of griever if we are to survive and remain a functioning part of life.

Each month as I put together this newsletter, I search through the collections of writings and stories that I have shared with so many compassionate friends through the years. Each time I come upon something I've written, or others have written that I want to share again, I am so glad I have this newsletter to make that sharing possible. After all these years, though it saddens me to know so many have joined our community, it gladdens me to be able to share the journeys of so many who have come before. We know that time is on our side as we travel this road. Here's what it was like for me in 2001 after eight years....

GOOD GRIEF

We have just marked the 8th anniversary of Peter's death. Three weeks ago, we "celebrated" what would have been his 30th birthday with several of our Compassionate Friends. Miraculously we turned what was an anxiety driven occasion into a beautiful day celebrating Peter's life and the lives of all our missing children. As I write this I marvel at the distance we've traveled on this remarkable journey. Eight years ago, it would have seemed incomprehensible that a) I would be alive, b) I would be living what appears as a fairly normal, if excessively busy life, and c) that we would have incorporated our beloved, invisible only child into our remaining days.

The effort of producing this newsletter exposes me to an abundance of writings about grief. One of my greatest sources of information comes from my dear friend Jerry Papkoff who edits the Brentwood/Santa Monica California newsletter while his wife Barbara serves as chapter leader. So much of what you read in these pages are discovered in Jerry's newsletter. I recently read an article Jerry found in Bereavement Magazine (con't on page 3)

If we are to be effective, we must be an equipped griever. We must meet and dialogue with other seasoned grievers. We need to know what it is they did and are continuing to do. In the beginning, they are the only history we have as grievers. It was through the recovery of others and knowing the paths of their personal journey that I could gauge my own grief journey. For me, my local TCF chapter was the gathering place for the dialogue.

To be equipped, we must be filled with grieving habits. We must learn what has helped others grieve in a positive fashion. We must not stuff our grief away because it makes others uncomfortable. Repressed grief only sits and festers... eventually it will rise and consume you. Personally, for me, a regular time to read, journal, look at pictures, and to close the door and weep to my heart's content were my most effective grieving habits.

To be equipped, we must take the time to be informed about grief, aware of its impact on our life and admit that we will, for a time, be governed by its hold over us. Until Lee died, I never knew that there were books about grief. Now I seek those sections of the bookstore looking for anything new that might add another level to the depth and strength of my recovery.

If we are to be effective, we must be an enabled griever. An enabled griever knows that they cannot "do" this journey alone. They must find that source greater than themselves and allow it to spend them and be their source of energy. Letting go to a higher power enables us to move forward. I know that I could never have buried my son and smile today unless someone/something bigger than me was, and still is, at work.

If we are to be effective, we must be an entrusted griever. We have to be entrusted with the knowledge that we really do know ourselves better than what others "think" is best for us. We must remain accountable to ourselves for that recovery. We must be entrusted to join hands with others to help speak up for and support those still in the early stages of their grief. We must be in a place where we can say to others, "I'm not up here in my recovery, but I am out there beside you."

If we are to be effective, we must be an emancipated griever. We must be set free to be the new person we have become since the death of our child. The old person is gone, and a new person has emerged. We have to be courageous enough to say to the world "I am a new person but I am still a good person who now has a depth of compassion that can make a difference."

If we are to be effective, we must be an emboldened griever. We must be bold enough to risk speaking up for others and ourselves. We must be bold enough to risk losing some old friends and to gaining new friends. We must be bold enough to tell someone close to us that we hurt and are having a really bad day instead of keeping that to ourselves. We must be bold enough to have a good day and not feel guilty about it. We must be bold enough to risk putting out our hand and grasping life again.

In the process of becoming a new breed of griever, we have challenges to face:

- 1. We cannot be afraid of the future. We must always, always remember, but not worship, the past. It is important that we also pay attention to the present but not treasure it. The past won't return, and the present is slipping away and will be gone in the next moment. However, when we become a griever of the future, we are looking forward and acknowledge that the future is really all that we have whereby we can make a difference.
- 2. We must not be afraid to exert ourselves as seasoned grievers. We must be willing to let others know what we have done to survive. We must be willing to step forward to help.
- 3. We must not be afraid to take a risk for recovery. We must dare to stop asking ourselves, "what if I always feel this way?" and begin to ask ourselves, "what if I tried and it worked?" We must be willing to risk "getting better".
- 4. We must not be afraid to reap the benefits of joining our family and friends in the abundance of joy and love that surrounds us daily. We must not be afraid to celebrate the good that comes our way.
- 5. We mut not be afraid to let ourselves be risked with the recovery of another bereaved parent. Once you have gone past the first day without your child, you have one day more experience than the newly bereaved. You are one day ahead of them and one day wiser. You can help.

Six years later I look back and can now reply to those early questions:

- How do I heal when I have no previous experience as a bereaved parent?
- How do I do this thing called "recovery from loss"?
- How do I become (in the eyes of the world) a "respectabe griever"?

I marvel that life is good again. I survived and am now experienced enough to help others. I didn't do this thing called "recovery from loss" alone; I did it with others who loved me at the lowest moment of my life. I no longer look around and expect the world to understand, so I no longer worry if I am considered a respectable griever. I'm just a mother whose only child died and I feel respectable enough to smile and say "hello" to life.

So, if you are a newly bereaved parent, hang in there...become equipped, enabled, entrusted, emancipated and emboldened. Do it in your time. Do it in ways that help you and don't hurt others. You no longer have to meet society's standards. Remember, you are a new breed of griever, and we, the seasoned grievers, will be there to support you. May today bring you peace. May tomorrow bring you one moment of joy.

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#### REMEMBERING

Go ahead and mention my child The one that died, you know, Don't worry about hurting me further. The depth of my pain doesn't show.

Don't worry about making me cry. I'm already crying inside.

"Help me heal by releasing the tears that I try to hide.

I'm hurt when you just keep silent, pretending it doesn't exist.
I'd rather you mention my child, knowing that he has been missed.

You asked me how I'm doing. I say "pretty good" or "fine". But healing is something ongoing. I feel it will take a lifetime.

# Happy thoughts for The Heart by Elaine Stillwell

While we are grieving the loss of a loved one its important to find positive things to tell our heads, anything that will give us inspiration to keep going. Whether it is a popular phrase that motivates us, a song that keeps ringing in our ears, a book, article or poem that speaks to our hearts, or perhaps a sweet prayer that gives us strength, we all need some inspiring thoughts to help lift the burden of our sadness..

When my two oldest children, twenty-one-year-old Denis and nineteen-year-old Peggy, were killed in the same car accident, I found myself searching bookstores and libraries for books that would tell me how others survived such an agonizing loss. As I found certain pages and phrases that were meaningful to me, I copied them down and shared them with my husband and remaining daughter. I found that just a few words could change how I looked at the day. Putting "happy thoughts" into my head gave me a whole new perspective. It was like putting on rose-colored glasses. My vision of the future improved, my attitude changed and I began to feel I would make it through this Valley of the Shadow. Maybe some of my "happy thoughts" might help you:

#### Doing grief work is like being a trapeze artist.

Balance and timing are everything. Letting go too soon and holding on too long are equally dangerous. Finding ways to maintain the attachment goes hand in hand with letting go as a primary grief-work lesson. Often the manner of staying attached is also a manner of infusing meaning back into our life. We have learned that we don't really recover, we adapt. We alter our values, attitudes, perceptions, relationships and beliefs. We become different than the person we once were. How I fought that idea! I liked the old me, but honestly, how could I stay the same person after burying two of my children? What a great gymnast I became!

#### God knows, and that is good enough for me.

We all ask the same eternal question, "why?" There never is an answer of course, but we ask it anyway – many times over – always hoping that the answer will appear in neon lights, illuminating that wonderful comfort that has eluded us. In a book I was reading, a young widow who lost her husband in a motorcycle accident exclaimed, "God knows, and that is good enough for me!"

(Sept/Oct 1999) by Rev. Paul A. Meltzer called "No Finish Line for Grief". In it Rev. Meltzer discusses "an appreciation of the fact that grievers form an inner sense of continued bond with deceased loved ones. Survivors hold the deceased in loving memory for long periods, often forever. This inner representation allows a sense of connection and interaction with the physically absent, but emotionally present loved one. The paradox of grief in their view is that "good grief" seems to result in both a letting go and a remaining involved"

I think back now to those early days when I feel melancholy and need my grief to be weighted down by tears. I can draw on every vivid detail of the experience...learning of Peter's sudden death in a brutal car accident caused by a reckless friend driving on a rain slicked road at terrifying high speed...my keening screams that so damaged my vocal chords I was forced to weep soundlessly for weeks...the activities of death...funerals, staying home to receive sympathetic callers, praying, trying to comprehend.

I think of the years trying to cope with life without Peter present. Reading all that I could in the hope of discovering this might be a manageable condition and discovering that I was indeed in the company of millions who were in lockstep with me trying to sort out their own grief. Finding support in attending Compassionate Friends meetings and befriending so many wonderful people willing to share their own experience so that I could learn to manage my own.

I realize now that Phil and I have incorporated Peter so totally in our lives, we barely notice if people flinch when we refer to him, which we do all the time. Because so many of our friends now are also bereaved parents, we all refer to our kids whenever stories are told about the past. Usually we laugh. And every little mention keeps our children in the present. Good grief.

I remember in the beginning, the silence of friends and family, the unwillingness to speak Peter's name. As if doing so might remind me that he was dead. As if I could forget. And it's the fear of forgetting that is so prominent in our minds. The fear of forgetting what he looked like, or what he sounded like. The fear of forgetting how much it hurt. The fear of accepting the loss. The fear of not grieving anymore for our treasured children.

For eight years now Peter has been my main focus. I wonder what he would be doing. I wonder if he would have been married by now and if I would be a grandma. I always wanted to be a grandma. Instead he is my indelible child, forever 22, unencumbered by the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune. The many memorials we have created in his name, all meant to keep him here, in the present, include an academic scholarship at his high school, and an adoption center for the cats he so loved here on earth and a park bench with a brass plaque bearing his name. All good grief.

Through my writing I have introduced him to so many who might never have known him if he hadn't traveled out of this world. Keeping him here in the present time, in a world that should have been his, has become my mission. I'm grateful that I live in a time when it is acceptable to include our missing children in our lives. That we can continue to share memories and stories about them and not be encouraged to keep the loss to ourselves and "move on with our lives" without them. Phil and I have a ritual. Every Friday night we light a candle that burns for the entire weekend. Our little ceremony includes a mini conversation with him and bids him welcome. We always feel he is with us while the candle burns. Good grief.

There surely is no timetable for grieving. We will always grieve the loss of Peter. But after eight years we've concluded this is probably as good as it will ever get. Peter will never be further away or closer than he is now. Until we meet again.

Sadly, each meeting brings new parents. *THINK BACK...* what would it have been like for you if there had not been any "oldtimers" to welcome you and share your grief and encourage you and tell you that in time, the pain will soften...with time, there is hope.
